3	The penalty for a live-ball foul by the defensive team is administered from the basic spot, except when that spot is in the end zone.	Fund X-8	True	
4	<p>K35 is attempting a free kick from the K40 yard line. The untouched free kick is caught by K24 at the R25 yard line with no Team R players in the vicinity. The ball is blown dead immediately.</p> <p>a) Legal play, 1st and 10 for K at the R25 yard line.</p> <p>b) Kick catching interference against K, 1st and 10 for R at the R25 yard line. <b>This answer is incorrect. See comment.</b></p>	6-5-6	{b} Answer {b} is wrong. See comment.	<p><b>Answer {b} is wrong from the author of the challenge. The available answers do not consider the new rule for 2013. The correct answer should be rekick from the previous spot with a 15 yard penalty against K -- OR -- R may choose an awarded fair catch after enforcement of a 15-yard penalty enforced from the spot of the foul. After enforcement, team R may snap or free kick. Everyone receives a point for this question.</b></p>
5	<p>With six minutes remaining in the 2nd quarter, after the ball is blown dead from a running play but the clock is still running, an official kills the clock because a player is favoring an injured knee.</p> <p>a) The player says he is OK and is allowed to remain in the game.</p> <p>b) The head coach calls a timeout to allow the player to gain his composure to see if his knee is OK so he can come back in after the timeout.</p> <p>c) The player must leave the game for one down. He cannot talk his way back into the game or "buy" his way back into the game with a timeout.</p>	3-5-10	{c}	<p>An official's time-out (which is not charged to either team) occurs, and the player shall be replaced for at least one down, unless halftime or an overtime intermission occurs when:</p> <p>1) An apparently injured player is discovered by a game official while the ball is dead and the clock is stopped and for whom the ready-for-play signal is delayed, or for whom the clock is stopped. The player shall be replaced for at least one down, unless the halftime or an overtime intermission occurs. This time-out, if not charged, is an official's time-out.</p>
